**Cool It** The right wine fridge can be a game-changer. Here are three F&W-approved picks.

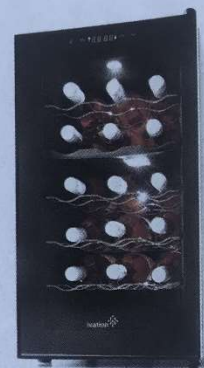
